

Registration for a judge course

Step 1:

Contact your State/Territory Association to find out dates of judging courses.

Step 2:

Find your State/Territory Association Judging course application and send to your State/Territory Association with payment.

Please note: Gymnastics Australia contracts the State/Territory Associations as Registered Training Provider partners to deliver all Courses.

Step 3:

Complete pre-course requirements where required. For some courses pre-course reading may be provided.

Gymnastics Australia (GA) would like to advise all prospective judges, that the Australian Sports Commission (ASC) expects that new officiating candidates of all sports with accreditations in the National Officiating Accreditation Scheme will complete the ASC officiating general principles course. GA recommends that this course is completed prior to attending the judging specific day and endorses the online opportunity currently fully subsidised by the ASC.

Step 4:

Attend a Judging course. Candidates will receive all notes at the course.

It is recommended that candidates take a copy of the Australian (National) Levels Program with them to the course; your club should be able to help you with this.

Step 5:

If you pass, you will receive a congratulations letter from your State/Territory Association. If you are not a Technical Member, you will also receive an application form within a few weeks of the course. The fee that you need to pay will be indicated on the application form.

You will need to send the Technical Member application form to Gymnastics Australia with the nominated payment within 3 months of receipt in order to become an accredited judge and be able to judge at competitions.
