	<b>Presentation</b>	<p>The GWA Board welcomed Liz Chetkovich (LC) and Peter Abbott (PA) from WAIS to the meeting. A presentation was given to the GWA Board in relation to a 'proposed concept' for further discussion in relation to an application for a WA State Acrobatic and Training Centre. It was noted that the venue would not only be relevant for gymnastics but could also provide support to a number of related State Sporting Associations that also require a facility that provides an environment for those sports that require specific training facilities and equipment for acrobatic skills training.</p> <p>It was noted that RK, ST, LC and PA had already met with a representative from DSR (Facilities section) in regards to the possibility of proceeding with the 'proposed concept'.</p> <p>After discussion the GWA Board agreed that the 'proposed concept' had merit and to this end would formally advise DSR of their support and a request for funding support in regards to the preparation and submission of a Feasibility Study. RK to advise DSR.</p>	RK to advise DSR.
2.0	<b>Acceptance of Previous Minutes</b>	The Board ratified the minutes from the Board Meeting held on the 15 April 2010.	
3.0	<b>Business Arising from previous minutes</b>	<p><b>3.1 Perception of GWA Board</b></p> <p>RK noted that the information as discussed by the Gymsports meeting on the 25 February 2010 had been tabled and discussed at the MG, WG, RG, CHEER and ACRO SMC meetings. The TRP SMC will be discussing the information at their June SMC meeting. This information and the research from the other States / Territories will be tabled for discussion at the Gymsports meeting on the 24 June 2010, the results of these discussions will then be tabled at the GWA Board meeting to be held in July 2010.</p>	

		<p><b>3.2 RG HPC – Future Intentions</b>  RK noted that to date the RG HPC had provided no formal response to the items discussed at the previous GWA Board meeting (s). RK did however note that at a meeting held on the 18 May 2010 the RG HPC had indicated verbally that they would not at this stage be establishing a RG club.</p> <p>The GWA Board noted the contents of a letter from the RG HPC dated the 7 May 2010. RK also provided further information from the meeting held on the 18 May 2010. In doing so the GWA Board noted the following;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The RG HPC would be increasing the hourly usage of the State Gymnastics Centre Hall 2 throughout 2010. As a result this would therefore increase the payments required for their facility hire.</li> <li>• The GWA Board noted the concerns of RG HPC in regards to additional expenses, noting that this was also a concern for GWA.</li> <li>• It was agreed that RK would formally respond to the letter from the RG HPC.</li> </ul> <p><b>3.3 2010 GWA Fee Structure</b>  <b>Request from RG SMC in relation to pairs/trios/groups – Event Entry Fees</b>  The GWA Board noted that the discussion by the RG SMC was ongoing in relation to this matter.</p> <p><b>3.4 2010 GWA / GA Education Courses</b>  The Board noted that both SCH and RK would provide a report of the discussions at the forthcoming GA meetings (30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> May) at the June GWA Board meeting.</p> <p><b>3.5 AusCheer</b>  RK tabled the response from GA in relation to this ongoing matter. It was noted that the majority of issues raised by GWA with GA still required ongoing discussion at the forthcoming GA meetings (30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> May), SCH and RK to provide a report at the June GWA Board meeting.</p> <p>The GWA Board also noted that GA had indicated that they will be commencing a review of the AusCheer operating model and that a briefing in relation to the review process would be provided at the forthcoming GA Presidents meeting (30 May). ### 3.7 GSCS and NW Regions

#### **GSCS (new name – Southern Regional Gymnastics Assoc Inc [SRGA]).**

The GWA Board noted the Minutes of the GSCS AGM held on the 27 March 2010. In relation to section 8.1.1 (Constitution) of the minutes, the GWA Board discussed the matter of non-members to GWA / gymnastics being allowed membership to the regional association. It was agreed that at this stage this would not be acceptable to GWA Board, however it was noted that at a GA level their continued to be discussions in relation to membership of gymnastics, particularly in relation to the AusCheer gymsport. As further information became available this may require some further discussion.

GWA Board once again congratulated the SRGA on all their work to date.

#### **NW Region**

RK provided the GWA Board with an update in relation to the NW Region;

- The NWRGA was currently facing difficulties in relation to their ongoing operations. To this end RK had held a meeting with Rose Clark (President) and then also with Rose Clark and Tim Mahon from DSR in relation to ensuring that all the DSR requirements were fulfilled so they could apply for funding in the period 2010 / 2011.
- After discussion it had been agreed that in the short term the NWRGA needed to move forward in relation to employing a part time administrator. To this end a letter had been sent to all clubs in the region in relation to the employment of an administrator, at this stage they were still awaiting replies to this letter. It was noted that a majority positive response from the clubs would enable the employment option to proceed.
- It was noted that a number of the clubs in the NW had requested assistance in relation to Education courses, fast tracking of coach education / accreditation, applying for DSR funding and scholarships, and other related matters. GWA office Services and

		<p>Development section was making contact with all clubs so as to offer assistance.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It was noted that at this stage the only club for the region that had not affiliated due to lack of coaches was Newman Gymnastics Club.</li> <li>• RK also noted that Karratha Club (over 400 members in 2009) was now having quite major issues in relation to their facility requirements, this was now impacting on both the growth of the club (a waiting list of over 300 children) and a continual workload for the coaches in relation to set up and pack down of the gym equipment. The GWA Board noted that they would continue to monitor this matter and assist as and when required.</li> </ul>	
<b>4.0</b>	<b>Finance</b>	<p><b>4.1 2010 Finance</b> GWA Board reviewed the 2010 finances.</p> <p><b>4.2 GWA Debtors</b> The GWA Board noted the following in relation to the following 'bad debts';</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Flames Gymnastics Club was now at the bailiff stage of debt collection. It was noted that this involved a fortnightly payment until the payment of the total amount, this also included reimbursement for the associated legal costs.</li> <li>• Esperance Twilight Aerials Gymnastics Academy (2006 debt - \$5,507.14), RK noted that to date GWA had not received a response to their letter sent. To this end the matter had now been referred to the debt collectors.</li> </ul> <p><b>4.3 GWA Club and Technical Membership Update</b> The GWA Board noted that as of the 17 May there were 5,610 registered athletes (2009 = 5,567 registered athletes) and 343 registered Technical Members (2009 = 345 registered Technical Members). At this stage the GWA Board indicated that there were satisfied with the 2009 and 2010 comparison reports.</p> <p>The GWA Board ratified the affiliation of the following two GWA Clubs;</p> <p>Aqua Jetty YMCA and Gascoyne Gymnastics Club.</p> <p>The GWA Board ratified the affiliation of the following one GWA Associations / Supporters / In-School Providers;</p>	

Western Australian Institute of Sport (WAIS).

\*The GWA Board noted that there has been a significant increase in attendees at the first AusCheer event. It was further noted that it was likely there would be at least a further two teams entered as 'late entries' which would further increase the numbers. GWA Board also noted that there had been no entries from clubs that were not either currently or previously affiliated with GWA.

\*\*The GWA Board noted that the Winter State Championships had also shown a significant increase in attendees, however this increase also included all MG competitors for 2009 and the fact that ACRO Series #2 and TRP (Age) had been included within this competition. It was noted that the combined State Championships numbers for 2009 were 1704 competitors, these figures would therefore need to be compared after the Spring State Championships in September 2010.

RK noted that whilst at this stage the competition numbers showed a promising comparison with 2009, GWA needed to continue to monitor the TRP Gymsport competition entries and the overall competition entries for the forthcoming Club Level competitions.

#### Letter of Complaint – Spectator Fees

RK tabled a letter of complaint from a parent in relation to GWA Competition Spectator entry fees. The GWA Board acknowledged the issues in the letter particularly in relation to the increasing costs for a family that has a child that competes in the sport of gymnastics. The GWA Board

	<p>noted that the balance of affordability and costs to the organisation were always a concern to the organisation, however due to increasing costs to GWA there had had to be an increase across all sections of the community. RK to respond formally to the letter.</p> <p><b>4.5 MG HPC</b>  The GWA Board noted that Elena Bespalova continued to on extended sick leave / annual leave. The GWA Board continued to wish her well in the coming weeks.</p> <p>The GWA Board once again noted their ongoing concerns in relation to this programs budget. RK tabled the projected budget for 2010 reflected an overall loss of over \$40,000. It was noted that the Quarter One Profit and Loss statement indicated a current deficit of just under \$2000 (including the bad debt write off from 2009). The GWA Board noted that this matter needed to be monitored carefully.</p> <p>GM formally advised the GWA Board that Star-Mites Gymsports would be / had established a High Performance program within their club, this being for the lower level 1 – 3 athletes.</p> <p><b>4.6 GWA Staffing Matters</b>  The following was noted;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• RK noted that Kristina Dufour (GWA Receptionist and Administrator) has resigned as of the 21 May 2010. GWA Board wished her well in her future, and thanked her for her support and commitment to GWA.</li> <li>• Further RK noted that after discussion with GWA Managers and SCH, it had been agreed that given the ‘time of the year’ was extremely busy which would make training of a new staff member difficult that GWA would employ on a short term basis (end May to the end of October 2010) Mark Kural and Adele Taylor. The GWA Board welcomed and thanked both Mark and Adele for their support of the organisation. It was noted that the status of this position would need to be reviewed in September 2010.</li> <li>• RK also noted that in relation to the short term employment of a Regional Administrator by the SRGA and possibly the NWRGA, that Helen Westley had been contracted by the SRGA. It was noted that Helen was currently was the Secretary for the NWRGA who was based in Perth, and thus bought much experience as to the operations of coordinating and supporting a Regional Association (s). RK noted that GWA had offered the support of the GWA office in relation to this appointment, this included access to the GWA Office and specific regions@gymnasticswa.asn.au email address and other related items.</li> </ul>	<p>RK to respond to the letter.</p>
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		<p><b>4.8 Letter from Olympic Gymnastic Academy.</b>          RK tabled further information and advice received in relation to the possible affiliation of the Olympic Gymnastic Academy. The GWA Board thanked Olympic Gymnastics Academy for their interest and agreed at this stage they would not approve the affiliation to GWA by the Olympic Gymnastics Academy. RK is to notify the Olympic Gymnastics Academy accordingly.</p> <p><b>4.9 Actions to date in regards to the GWA Board meeting – 29 March 2010.</b></p> <p><b>Judging Coordinators response</b>          The GWA Board noted the ‘in principle’ agreement by all attendees at the 22 April 2010 Judging Coordinators meeting (Section 6.6) in relation to the \$1.50 per competition entry by GWA to the individual Judges Assembly. It was noted that this matter had also been discussed and agreed at the MG, RG and CHEER SMC’s. It had been tabled at the WG SMC with no objections and AER, ACRO and TRP had yet to have the opportunity to discuss this matter at their SMC meetings.</p> <p>The GWA Board noted an ‘in principle’ support by MG and WG to the concept of purchasing a GWA Proscore scoring system.</p> <p><b>Sale of the GWA Container and Floor</b>          The GWA Board noted that these items have been sold. 5.0	General Business	<p><b>5.1. GWA HPC Briefing Paper</b>          RK noted that the briefing paper had been circulated prior to the meeting. It was noted that this paper had been prepared for presentation to DSR in regards to High Performance at GWA. Further that RK and ST had attended a meeting with Consultants at DSR in relation to the ongoing requirements of the High Performance programs within GWA. The following was noted in relation to this matter;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It was noted that GWA currently has three formal High Performance programs in MG, WG and RG.</li> <li>• It was noted that GWA currently had two further gymsports who had reached / would shortly reach High Performance program status, these being AER and TRP respectively.</li> <li>• GWA has reviewed and adopted an athlete / coach progression pathway structure that had been introduced by WAIS. In total GWA has 208 athletes included in the High Performance Progression Pathways, this includes those athletes within the Development and Talent Identification pathways.</li> </ul>	

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There needed to be ongoing assessment and evaluation of the following areas; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The role of WAIS programs and scholarships.</li> <li>• The role of the State Sporting Association - GWA.</li> <li>• The role of the club (s) affiliated to the State Sporting Association.</li> <li>• The role of the HP Centres and programs.</li> <li>• Possible funding opportunities / partnerships with WAIS, Gymnastics Australia (GA), DSR and other possible sources.</li> <li>• Facility Opportunities / requirements for high performance training environments.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>It was agreed the ST and RK would provide a further update at the next GWA Board meeting.</p> <p><b>5.2 GWA Marketing – the concept.</b> The information provided to GWA by Selmore Services was circulated prior to the meeting. The GWA Board agreed to the ‘concept’ information in relation to the Marketing proposal and asked that RK contact Selmore Services in relation to progressing this project.</p> <p><b>5.3 DSR – GWA Overall Coach of the Year</b> The GWA Board noted that DSR had introduced a Coach of the Year Award for both elite and community coaches. This was not an Award as per the ANZ Sports Star of the Year, rather an award that allowed sports to recognise the coaches within the community. As GWA currently does not have a mechanism for an overall GWA Coach of the Year, after discussion the GWA Board agreed that GWA should investigate the introduction of a GWA Overall Coach of the Year – Elite (International competitions) and GWA Overall Coach of the Year - Community, this being for all coaches coaching athletes in a domestic only capacity including both competitions and recreational / Kindergym. The GWA Board asked this be tabled as an agenda item for the forthcoming GWA Gymsports meeting to be held on the 24 June, 2010.</p> <p><b>5.4 Gymnastics Professionals of Australia</b> The GWA Board noted the information received from this group.</p> <p><b>5.5 Town of Vincent (TOV) – Variation to Lease – Landgate Lodgement</b> The GWA Board noted they had finally received a copy of the signed lease from TOV, it was noted however this was not the GWA original version, only a photocopy of the document. The GWA Board noted the information required in relation to changes for Landgate Lodgement. 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<p><b>6.0</b></p>	<p><b>Committee Reports</b></p>	<p>The GWA Board noted minutes and reports as had been supplied by the following;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• GWA Gymsport's section</li> <li>• GWA SMC's</li> <li>• GWA Services and Development Section</li> </ul> <p><b>6.1 GWA Gymsport's Section Report</b> The GWA Board noted the report as tabled.</p> <p><b>Pacific Rim Championships (28 April – 2 May 2010)</b> The following athletes represented Australia at the Championships;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MG – Martin Jozwiak (Reserve) – withdrew due to injury</li> <li>• WG – Emily Little – 5<sup>th</sup> All-round, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vault and 3<sup>rd</sup> Team.</li> <li>• RG – Janine Murray – 8<sup>th</sup> All-round, 3<sup>rd</sup> Team.</li> </ul> <p><b>Winter State Championships</b> The GWA Board noted the following in relation to this event;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Planning for the event is well under way.</li> <li>• MG SMC will be bringing in two interstate judges.</li> <li>• The RG Commonwealth Games Squad will be attending a training camp prior to the championships and then will compete at the GWA State Championships on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> June 2010.</li> </ul> <p><b>GA / GWA National Championship Hosting – WG and RG</b> The GWA Board thanked Amelia Foster for volunteering to act as the Volunteer Coordinator for both events.</p> <p><b>GWA State Team Selection Meetings – MG, WG and RG</b> The selection meetings for these teams will all be held on the 24<sup>th</sup> May 2010. The following GWA Board members will convene a GWA Ratification meeting on the 25<sup>th</sup> May 2010 – SCH, RE and RK.</p> <p>The GWA Board also noted that GWA had had to readvertise for further Team Managers and Chaperones for all of the teams. GWA Board agreed that if required both the WG and RG State Team could investigate the option of part-time Chaperones – this would be as per 2009 and would mean that the appointed part time Chaperones would receive no funding assistance from the GWA State Team.</p>	
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In relation to the WG WAIS athletes the GWA Board agreed that these athletes would be required to pay the \$100 administration levy, but would not be required to pay the HOD / staff levy. This was because WAIS would be covering all expenses in relation to the team staff members.

#### **GWA State Team – Errata**

The GWA Board approved the following errata in relation to the GWA Appeals and Grievances Regulations with the following to be added to section 6.1;

Section 6.1.1 The Appeals meeting will be conducted in the following procedure;

- The Appeals Committee will meet with the club / judge making the appeal.
- The Appeals Committee will then meet with the Selection Committee representative.
- The Appeals Committee will then meet with the club / judge making the appeal.

#### **6.2 MG**

##### **Elliott Cook – Australian Representation**

The GWA noted that Elliott Cook (Vital / MG HPC) would be competing at the Moscow World Cup and the Dityannin Cup in May 2010. The GWA Board wished him well in these competitions.

##### **MG Qualifying Competition #2**

The GWA Board formally recorded their concern that sessions for this competition had been postponed due to the non availability of ‘higher level’ judges. GWA Board requested that MG SMC review this matter and provide GWA Board with their recommendations / actions so as to ensure that this situation does not occur again at a future competition in either 2010 or 2011. It was noted that Winter State Championships would see two interstate judges coming to the event to assist with judging at the competition.

#### **6.3 WG**

##### **Expression of Interest Form – WG USA Tour**

The GWA Board noted the information supplied to the meeting in relation to the WG USA Tour.

The GWA Board noted that the following had been completed;

- The formation of the Organising Committee and the selection / election of a Chairperson for this group.

- The Organising Committee had meet in relation to fundraising ideas – the GWA Board noted that these ideas could not contravene Healthway requirements in relation to alcohol and 'junk food', nor could they hold a raffle at the GWA State Championships as this was a State event only.
- The GWA Board approved the two changes to the proposal in relation to the increase of Level 9 / 10 athletes and an additional coach.

The GWA Board noted the following was still outstanding;

- The selection and appointment process for the Team Management, in particular the selection of the Head of Delegation to work with both the Organising Committee and GWA Gymsports section staff.
- The completion of a 'final budget' for the tour.

**WG State Team Selection – Olivia Vivian (2008 Olympian)**

The GWA Board approved the proposal from the WG SMC in relation to the qualification process for Olivia Vivian in relation to selection within the WG State Team. In doing so it noted that this approval did not therefore exclude another club gymnast from being placed into the team and it would make the team more competitive as there would be five athletes instead of four.

**WG Errata**

The GWA Board approved the following errata in relation to WG State Selection - Level 9 / 10 Qualifying Scores for Australian Championships;

GWA WG State Selection Committee will use the GA national qualifying score (43.00) for GWA selection for WG Level 9 / 10 apparatus specialists instead of the increased WA All round qualifying score (45.00) which would be an average of 10.75. For an apparatus specialist this would involve;

- The Apparatus specialist would need to obtain this score at one competition.
- The Apparatus Specialist would then need to obtain the qualifying mark (10.75) for each apparatus / event they wished to be selected in.

## **6.4 RG**

### **Cancellation / Postponement of the RG Judges Invitational 26 – 28 March 2010**

The GWA Board approved the request by the RG SMC to host this event on the 1<sup>st</sup> August 2010. The GWA Board did not approve the request to change the competition entry fees.

It was also noted that Kieran Gorman and Eloise Kane will compete at the FIG World Series to be held in Italy in May 2010.
