

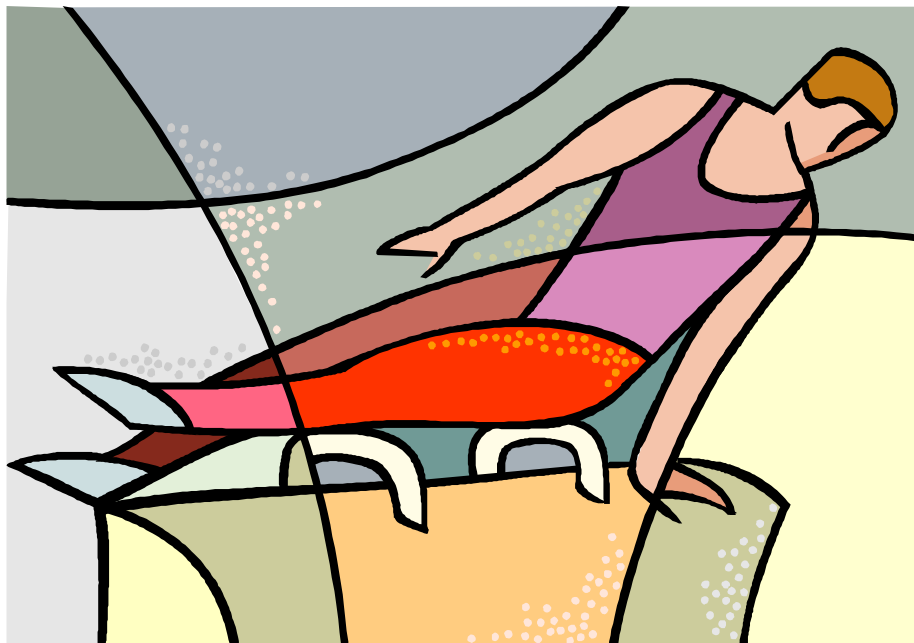

Gymnastics WA -2003 in summary

Gymnastics in Western Australia has had an outstanding year in all areas of operation. 2003 will be remembered for our unprecedented success in the competition arena balanced with the delivery of a high level of service to our Affiliated Clubs, and the achievement of small operating profit of \$2,683 for the Association.

Without question the year's highlights were the outstanding results of our Western Australian athletes, from the superb Bronze medal of our Australian Women's Team at World Championships, led by Allana Slater, to the selection of John Carroll in the Australian Men's team for World Championships (a first for WA since 1989), and the performances of our athletes at National and other events.

Each one of the seven gymnastic disciplines was once again expertly run by their own Sports Management Committee (SMC). This year has seen the ongoing development of each of the seven disciplines culminating in one of the most successful competition periods in the history of our sport. A special well done must go to all State representatives in Western Australian Gymnastic teams - gymnast, coaches, judges and managers - who proudly competed for our state at the various National Championships, and other events throughout the year.

Congratulations must go to our other International representatives; John Carroll, Martin Jozwiak and Ian Greenwell in Men's Gymnastics; Allana Slater, Amy Lauren, Daria Joura, and Olivia Vivian in Women's Gymnastics; Courtney Holloway, and Kate Dolan in Rhythmic Gymnastics; Leah Henville, Melissa Read, Melissa Davies, Kieran Gorman, Hannah Davies, Summer Van Loenhout, Alexandra Kane, Carmen Hayward, and Chloe Sargent in Sport Aerobics; and in International Women's Levels Nicole Smith, Jessica Bolton, Corri Keating, and Karen Morgan.

At National events WA athletes performed outstandingly.

- In Men's competition, in the Seniors John Carroll took the All Around silver medal and gold on Pommels and Vault. The U15 Team took the gold medal with Martin Jozwiak going on to take gold in the All Around and Pommels, Rings, Vault and High Bar

- In Women's, we returned from the Nationals with excellent results in both elite and levels competition. In fact WA took out seven of the ten gold medals on offer in the Senior and Junior International Divisions through Allana Slater, Daria Joura, Amy Lauren, and Olivia Vivian, and for the first time in six years of competition WA won Levels team medals.
- In Rhythmic, WA successfully hosted the RG National Championships in July, and WA took out 13 gold medals in elite and levels divisions.
- In Sport Aerobics, WA athletes had another outstanding National Championships winning 12 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze medals. WA also took out the National Coach of the Year award through Trudi Nurse, and the National Junior Athlete of the Year through Kieran Gorman.
- The State Trampoline team returned from their Nationals in Brisbane with some solid team performances. With strong team numbers there is certainly something to build on for the future.
- In Sports Acrobatics a small team of twelve athletes travelled to National Championships and a special well done to Krzysztof Pudelek and Catherine Trigwell who took out first place overall in the L7 Mixed Pairs.
- The Perth Angels Cheerleaders returned home from the 2003 Australian Championships triumphant, completing a meritorious set of back-to-back victories (2002, 2003).

The General Gymnastics discipline also continued to achieve at a high level. We saw the linking of gymnastics and the arts through the introduction of the highly acclaimed Cirque de Gymnastique, the successful annual GymFest event, the growth of Cheerleading, and the Wheel Team travel abroad on their first international trip in July.

Gymnastics was also in the spotlight at the prestigious WA Sports Federation's Sport Star awards. In another first for our sport, Jo Richards and Nikolai Lapchine took out the WA Coach of the Year, and Karon Williams took out the WA Official of the Year.

In the membership area, we have been able to maintain good gymnast numbers despite the decision of the PCYC not to

affiliate any of its centres. The PCYC withdrawal has resulted in a reduction in Club affiliations, and slight reduction in the Technical members. Notwithstanding, the strong membership, and range of events of offer has driven a record number of participants at Gymnastics WA events.

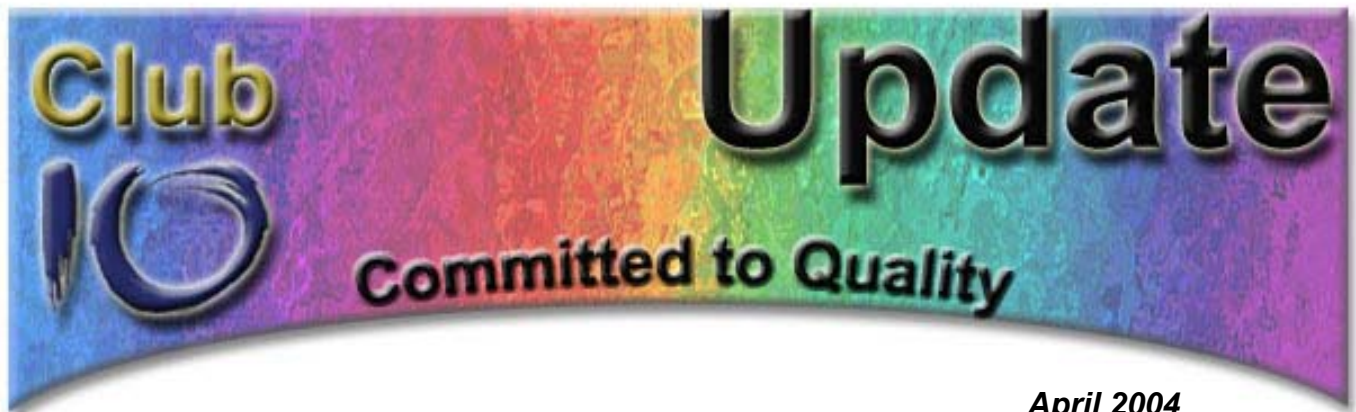
We have successfully launched the Club 10 program to all affiliated Clubs and the program has been met with enthusiasm by the majority of Clubs in WA.

At the Regional Association level we have seen outstanding contributions from the North West and the Great Southern Central South Associations. Of particular note was the recognition of the North West's Andrew McLaughlin who was awarded a Gymnastics Western Australia Award of Merit, and Life Membership of the NW Regional Gymnastic Association for his outstanding service to gymnastics in the region. The NW has also seen its second state representative, WA's first indigenous male athlete, Anthony Councillor from Hedland attend Men's National Championships.

In conclusion, 2003 was an outstanding year in all areas of operation. It will be remembered in particular for the unprecedented success of our athletes on the International and National stage and we can look forward with great optimism to building on this outstanding level of athletic performance. Three other focus areas for the future will be the further development of Clubs through the Club 10 program, continued improvement of the Association's financial position, and the furthering of our position to develop a dedicated State gymnastics venue.

Thank you to the Clubs, Committees, Club Volunteers, Coaches, Judges, Athletes, staff, and all those in the Regional Associations for what has been a very positive year. Gymnastics is a great sport, and your support is appreciated in helping as many people as possible enjoy its qualities.

Thank you also to our partners and major sponsors – the Department of Sport and Recreation, Healthway, WAIS, BHPBilliton; Woodside Energy Australia, Gymnastics Australia and Challenge Stadium.

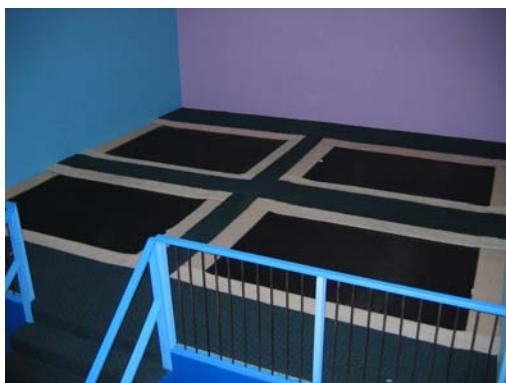
